A Message from the Executive Director

Donate Life Connecticut (DLC) is dedicated to the purpose of education and awareness for all Connecticut residents regarding the lifesaving and life-enhancing benefits of organ and tissue donation. We are further dedicated to increasing the number of registered organ donors. At DLC, we are also champions of living donation. As a living kidney donor myself, this mission has an even deeper meaning to me personally. In 2019, I gifted my kidney to an 18-year old boy named Cameron in Brooklyn, New York. By giving to the National Kidney Registry in this way, I was given a voucher, which I gave to my friend, Peter, in my hometown of Bristol, CT. With the voucher, he was able to be placed at the top of the transplant list and receive the kidney he was waiting for. It is a great privilege and honor to be the Executive Director of DLC.

In 2022, after living in a global pandemic, we were hopeful as we began to gather again. The 32nd Annual Erica Grossman Visual Arts Contest was still held virtually in April, but we were able to gather in-person for the annual volunteer summit with New England Donor Services at the Connecticut Hospital Association in June. We began to speak to high school students, driving school students, and nursing students in person.

In the Summer of 2022, we created a video series, "Stories of Hope." We interviewed Connecticut residents from all facets of transplant who graciously shared their stories. These stories are featured on our website and presented when we speak to high school and college students. In September, we held our first in-person fundraiser at the Wadsworth Mansion as an Autumn Garden Party. The event featured live gypsy jazz, farm to table food, and a live artist. A short film was created and featured at the event to honor our Connecticut transplant nurses. In October, a team of volunteers from DLC were at the starting line of the Hartford Marathon, cheering on runners from across the state.

This year was the beginning of a re-emergence, like Spring, when new growth sprouts from every corner. Connecting with the transplant community in person again, sharing stories, shedding tears, showing compassion for those who lost loved ones, encouraging those who continue to wait on the list, and thanking the transplant teams who work so hard, brought us back to the roots of what Donate Life Connecticut stands for.

On behalf of myself and the Board of Directors, it is our honor to fulfill the mission of Donate Life Connecticut. We provide education and increase awareness regarding organ and tissue donation for Connecticut residents, and ultimately, we increase the number of lives saved through the miracle of transplant.


National Donate Life Month & Virtual Art Contest Award Ceremony






